

Welcome

The seaside resorts of Margate, Broadstairs and Ramsgate, are situated on the north-eastern coast of Kent. Each with their own character, offering quality attractions and facilities for the group trade to experience.

church is also the Shrine of St Augustine, the first Archbishop of Canterbury, who landed near here in AD 597. A fascinating historical and active place!









Ramsgate Tunnels
