CREATIVITY UNWRAPPED

The country-wide theme for 2023 is “Creativity Unwrapped”. From the painting of Pugin designs to the drawing of a church linked to Turner, to talks about circus showmen and tours of the house that inspired Charles Dickens, festival participants are invited to unwrap the history of some of Thanet’s creative persons and places.

Heritage Open Days is the country’s largest heritage festival with around 5,000 events, over 40,000 volunteers and more than three million visitors taking part. Celebrating local history, architecture and culture, the ten-day event offers everyone the chance to see hidden places and experience something new, all of which are completely free to explore, though donations are very welcome.

Heritage Open Days operates as part of the National Trust with funding from players of People’s Postcode Lottery. Established in 1994, it is England’s contribution to the European Heritage Days, which are held annually in September in 50 signatory states to the European Cultural Convention.

ARK, newly refurbished in the former Margate synagogue, was built in 1929 and retains a number of original features including decorative stained glass windows and the ladies' gallery.

Visit the 'CliftonvilleVoices' exhibition which commemorates the rich Jewish history of the area as well as celebrating its current diverse communities. The history of Cliftonville is explored through neighbourhood resident interviews, past and present, using film, displays and an immersive soundscape.

Joy C Martindale, a local artist, led refugee and migrant mothers, as part of the United Mothers Project, in Margate and Samphire, Dover, to create the art show 'Mother Trees Connect the Forest'. Come along to view this glorious and fascinating show.

St John's has been a place of worship since 1050. Points of interest include its Norman origins, a stone font dating from 1485, funeral hatchments bearing coats of arms, stained glass and a carved reredos. The young Turner painted St John's, and the gravestone of Mrs. Booth, his landlady, stands in the churchyard.

Local historian, Robin Colyer, will be giving a guided tour of the church. There will be home baking, handmade crafts and special performances by organist David Lammler. Visitors of all ages are invited to explore their creativity by sketching their own view of St John's and comparing it with Turner's. Materials provided.

Come along to a talk 'Make Do and Mend - Creativity in Wartime' by Isaac Naylor.

Beneath Ramsgate lies an abandoned labyrinth of tunnels which extends for more than 3 miles under the town. This unique underground city was constructed as part of the town's air raid precautions in 1939 and includes a former mainline railway tunnel dating back to 1863.

The Grange was built by Augustus Pugin in 1845 and remained in the family until 1928. The building reflects Pugin's belief in the Gothic style as the only true Christian architecture and his ideal to live out his life in the Middle Ages. Pugin produced some of his finest work at The Grange, including designs for the House of Lords.

A rare chance to see inside St. Edward's Presbytery, built by Augustus Pugin in 1850 as part of this great architect's original conception for this exceptional Gothic revival site on Ramsgate's West Cliffs.

Picnics in the grounds welcome. Access ground floor only. Toilets. Street parking nearby.

The Italianate Glasshouse, a Grade II* listed historic monument, was erected in the grounds of East Cliff Lodge, Sir Moses Montefiore's 22 acre estate in 1832. The greenhouse was originally sited at Bretton Hall, Yorkshire. This delightful glasshouse was renovated in 2005 and is home to a tea garden, the proceeds of which contribute towards the upkeep of the greenhouse.

The reserve has new adventure fun trails for families to enjoy. Search the reserve for beautiful sculptures of our native wildlife or go on the hunt for brass rubbings, fairy houses and fossils! With brand new educational signage around the site, you can learn about British wildlife whilst you enjoy its serenity. There will be local history sessions in the museum and stalls selling antique books, crafts and games.
